

DORSET FEDERATION OF YOUNG FARMERS CLUBS

Briefing and guidance for Security Staff and Drug Dog Workers at YFC Club and County Events

This document has been produced to ensure a consistent and safe approach to managing the event where alcohol is being consumed. Clear communication and planning are needed to help reduce risk and running a safe and successful event.

Information before the event members should know?

The clubs are given prior notice of forth coming Club and County events. This gives time to order tickets and make arrangements for any 16 & 17 year old members wanting to attend within the County only, as they need to pre-order tickets. The under 18 members attending such an event must be accompanied by a responsible adult (aged 21 or over and a current member or leader). The same adult can only be responsible for 1 member at the same time. The adult needs to be in a fit state to supervise the members they are responsible for. If the under 18 is asked to leave the event their responsible adult must accompany them and ensure they are safe. For County Events we require 2 over 21 supervisors per under 18 for safeguarding purposes of it being a larger event and they must be of the same gender as the under 18 year old and be current members of Dorset YFC.

Before the event

- Security staff must be licensed and need to be carrying and displaying their SIA license badges. All security staff must sign in and give badge numbers on the sheet provided.
- The event senior steward should walk round the site with the security team leader and others if necessary before the event starts. Checks should include exits opening and final check for other hazards that may cause an issue during the event.
- Procedures for first aid and safe area will be discussed and agreed before the event starts.

During the event

- The Security staff along with the County Management Staff or Club Management at the entrance of the event will be responsible for checking the ID of all those entering the event. Identification for 18 & overs will need to be a photo driving license or other official form of photo ID such as, Passport or photo ID with pass hologram (if security are unsure of age a YFC membership card is not enough proof).
- Searches and bag searches are recommended at event, this will be carried out by the SIA staff.
- SIA staff are responsible for external and internal patrols during the event.
- The licence holder, senior stewards and security staff are entitled to refuse to admit or to serve anyone who is drunk and can request the person leaves the premises.
- At most events, searches will be carried out by security staff at the point of entry alcohol and other inappropriate items will be confiscated.
- All non-members must be 18 or over.

- 18 & overs and under 18's will be identified by different coloured wristbands along with the supervising members and contact numbers of the supervising members will be added to the under 18's wristbands.
- Any person found to be buying alcohol for a minor will also be asked to leave.
- Any person considered to be a hazard due to the amount of alcohol they have consumed will be refused further alcohol and may also be asked to leave the event.
- If a person is asked to leave the event due to drunken inappropriate behaviour we need to take steps to ensure they are safe. This could include informing friends so they can take care of them, ensuring they are kept warm until they can be transported home etc.
- The security will take responsibility of clearing people from the building and grounds at the end of the event or during an emergency evacuation.
- In the event of an incident a detail written report needs to be filled out by the security staff. The YFC senior steward will also fill out an incident report form. A copy of both this report needs to be given to the County Organiser. In more serious circumstances they may well be given straight to the Police or other relevant agencies.

Members aged 16 and 17

- Under 18 members attending such an event must be accompanied by a responsible adult (aged 21 or over and a current Dorset YFC member or leader). The same adult can only be responsible for 1 member at the same time and must be of the same gender. Each under 18 member needs to be with their responsible adult when they enter the venue. The adult needs to be in a fit state to supervise the members they are responsible for, for the duration of the event.
- A YFC steward will carry out random spot checks with a breathalyser at the point of entrance for 16 and 17 year old members if they feel this is necessary and there is one available. Those found with excessive levels of alcohol will be denied entrance and their responsible adult will ensure they are safe. If the minor does not have a responsible adult they will be offered support till they are collected by family or friend.
- 18 & overs and under 18's will be identified by different coloured wristbands as well as non over 18 members and supervising members (a copy of this will be given to the SIAs and First Aiders prior to the event so they are aware and copies of colours will be available on the evening.
- If an under 18 is seen with alcohol they will have this removed and given a final warning. If the same person is caught with alcohol on a second occasion at the same event they will be ejected from the event with their responsible adult.
- If an under 18 is drunk they will again be ejected from the event with their responsible adult. If the venue has a safe space both can wait inside till transport home is arranged.
- If the under 18 is asked to leave the event their responsible adult must accompany them and ensure they are safe. If the responsible person can't be found they are not to be ejected without another person being responsible for them. Parent or carers should also be informed if an under 18 is asked to leave and the responsible adult is not with them.
- In the event of an under 18 year old being left unsupervised by their responsible adult, then an alternative and appropriate person must be appointed and agreed on to take responsibility for them.

Drug Dogs

- A Drug dog and Security officer will be on the entrance of every party and will be in position for the full time that entry is open. The Officer of the dog will have full authority to not allow entry to anyone who is believed to have drugs on them.
- Security searches will be conducted on the door
- Those found in possession of drugs and substances including white powder, pills/tablets will be refused entry (no refunds issued) and will be reported to the police and/any other relevant authorities
- Those found in possession of any unfamiliar tags/fobs will be refused entry (no refunds given), the devices will be confiscated and reported/handed to the police

If at any time during the event it is felt that outside assistance is required such as Police or Ambulance, please ensure the YFC and security teams are kept informed.

Term 'responsible adult' = adult aged 21& over who is a member, leader or advisory

Please make sure you have the suitable posters to make sure those attending the event are aware of random searches and of the behaviour policy (similar to below) copies have been sent to all clubs and can be gained from the County Office

SEARCH POLICY

The event organisers will make random searches on entrance to the Dorset YFC Rally After Party.

Searches may include bags, including handbags, and will be conducted by County Staff/Security Staff.

Security Staff will also be conducting random body searches at the entrance.

Illegal drugs, including any white powder or legal highs will be reported to the police.

Alcohol bought outside the venue, any items considered to be dangerous, including penknives, will be confiscated and destroyed.
