<u>Classes</u>	
Class 1a YFC – Conventional	Open to any YFC member using a Conventional Plough. Each competitor must be a paid up member of a club affiliated to the National Federation of Young Farmers Clubs.
Class 1b YFC - Reversible/Commercial	Open to any YFC member using a Reversible Plough. Each competitor must be a paid up member of a club affiliated to the National Federation of Young Farmers Clubs.
Class 2 – Conventional	Open to anyone using a two-furrow Conventional Plough.
Class 3 – Conventional	Open to anyone using a Conventional Plough with Three or more Furrows.
Class 4–Classic	Open to anyone using a tractor manufactured before December 1976 without a Q cab, using a plough manufactured at the time. No Hydraulic rams or match ploughs.
Class 5–Vintage Trailed	Open to anyone using a tractor manufactured before December 1959, using a trailed plough manufactured at the time.
Class 6–Vintage Mounted	Open to anyone using a tractor manufactured before December 1959, using a hydraulic plough manufactured at the time. No Hydraulic rams or match ploughs.
Class 7 – Reversible/Commercial	Open to anyone using a reversible plough.

<u>Prizes</u>

Prize cards will be awarded for each class up to 4^{th} place. A perpetual trophy will be awarded to the winner of each class, and a match shield for the champion.

Additional cups or prizes will be awarded for the special prizes which include:

- Best looking overall outfit (Tractor, Plough)
- Best work done by a John Deere Tractor
- Best work done by a Ford or Fordson and Ransomes plough
- Best bye, finish, ins+outs for non-prize winners

Please return any trophies won at previous ploughing matches cleaned and engraved prior to, or on the day of the event.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. Rules for Reversible/Commercial Classes will be available on the day of the match.
- 2. Only 3 sighting poles to be used. No rolling of the split
- 3. The plough must not be in the ground on the site other than on the competitor's plot.
- 4. Competitors must report to the office by 9:30
- 5. Complete split by 10:00 or penalty points may be incurred.
- 6. Work will re-start when the judge says, and ploughing must be finished by 1:30pm Points will be deducted for late finish.
- 7. Double split method of opening to be used. After judging, plough 3 times around opening and then throw abroad against the plot adjacent to the higher number.
- 8. Each competitor's finish furrow to be thrown towards his own ridge.
- 9. Minimum depth 5", maximum 8" unless stated on the day.
- 10. Skimmers may be used.
- 11. Plough bodies must be in the ploughing position at all times.
- 12. Vary width ploughs must be set at the commencement of the match and not altered.
- 13. Pressing of the ridge by hand, foot, or the boot, slide dollies or any other machinery not at work is forbidden.
- 14. Points will be deducted if plot numbers are lost.
- 15. No competitor may enter more than 1 class.
- 16. A novice is described as a competitor that has not previously won first prize at a ploughing match.
- 17. The committee and landowner accept no liability whatsoever for damage or injury sustained at the event.
- 18. All trophies must be signed for at Site Office, and returned in good, clean condition. Any damage must be paid for
- 19. The committee reserve the right to split classes 1a and 1b if sufficient entries are received.
- 20. The committee reserve the right to amalgamate any class if insufficient entries are received.
- 21. The size and shape of some plots may be altered, pending entries.
- 22. Score sheets are only available after results are given out.
- 23. Judges' decision is final.
